

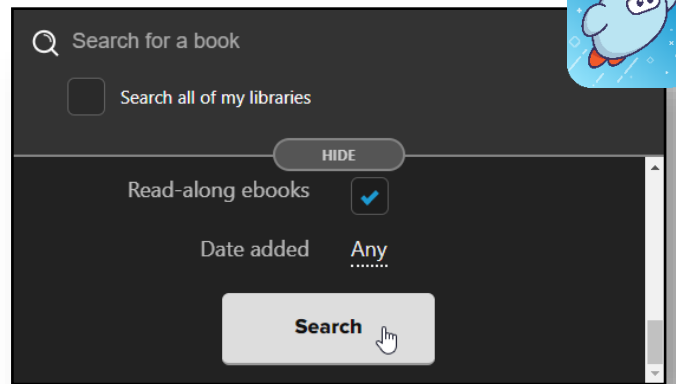
Read-Alongs in Sora

How can I use read-alongs? Consider the application of this format with your students and your curriculum. Use the ideas below to begin brainstorming.

- **Independent reading or learning centers**
This format can support students while they read independently or attempt more challenging books.
- **Build fluency with repeated reading**
Repeated reading can help students gain confidence reading along with the narrator and then on their own, changing the narration speed as needed. Invite students to create their own read-along and record their own narration.
- **Group reading**
Read-alongs can be projected when there aren't multiple copies available. Group reading settings can encourage collaborative discussion and modeling of good reading habits.
- **Build vocabulary**
Early learners can highlight sight words while reading, while older students can define, highlight, and leave a note for new vocabulary words.
- **Aid comprehension and decrease anxiety**
Professional narration can aid students' comprehension, allowing them to focus on their understanding.
