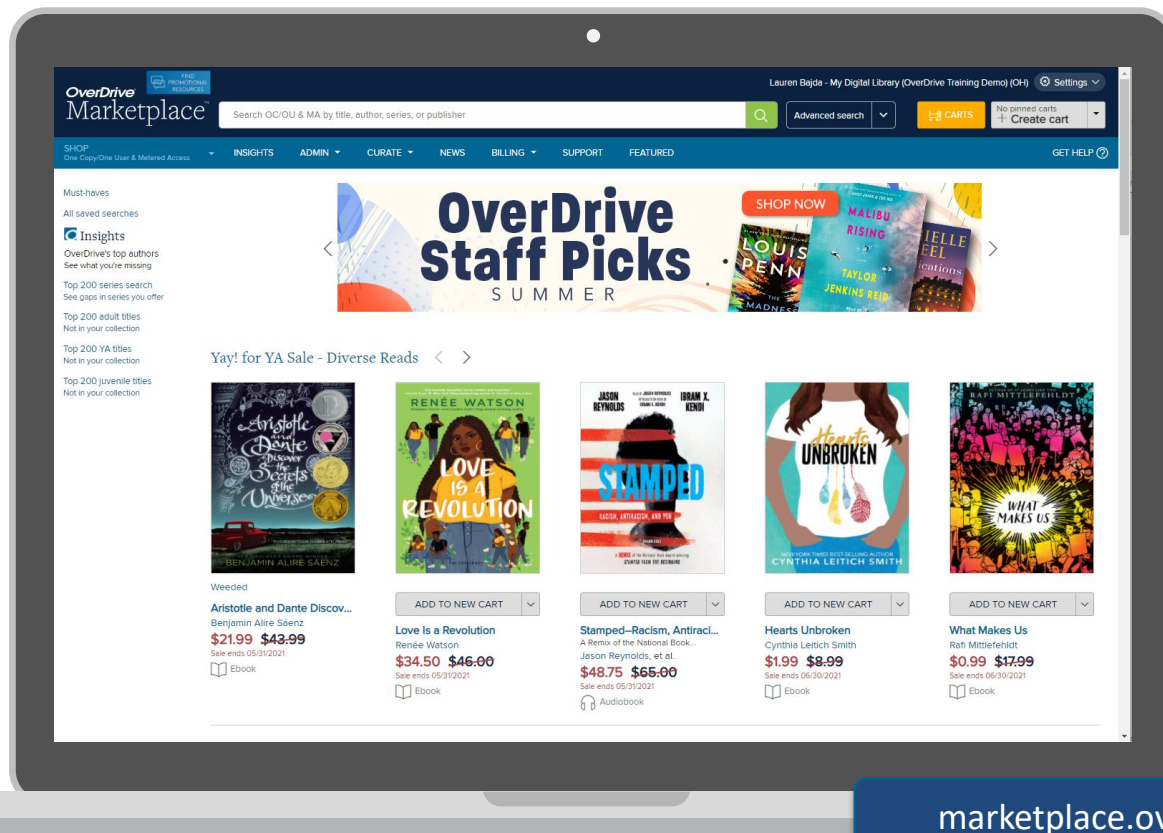


What

- The purpose of ARPA funding for U.S. libraries is **to provide pandemic response and relief**.
- This **can take many forms** to enable wellness and back-to-work, prevent learning loss, and address other pandemic-related services.
- Funds for materials and services must be used during the period of **June 1, 2021-September 30, 2022**.
- We expect that **reporting on the use of funds** following the term will be a key component of the legislation.
- Criteria for use of ARPA funds **varies by state**.

We aim to **support workflows and user journeys** that make it easy for partners to **use their funds, at their discretion.**

Shop - Important notes



We **strongly recommend** creating separate billing accounts for ARPA purchases with “ARPA” included in the name.



Any US public library, including **Advantage libraries**, will have the option to designate carts for ARPA funding.



Preorders can be added to ARPA carts but won't be prorated upon their street dates and won't be included on ARPA invoices.



For PRH, DK, Hachette US, Macmillan Publishers and Pottermore, the **24-month model** must be added to a cart for us to prorate price & end date.

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
